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Levels of proficiency of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)

A1	Can understand and form basic sentenc express needs of a concrete type, ask an answer questions about personal details
A2	Can communicate in simple and routi situations and exchange information of familiar matters.
B1	Can produce simple connected text on f miliar interest areas and give reasons an explanations for dreams, hopes, plans an opinions.
B2	Can understand complex texts on abstra topics and follow discussions in his or h field of specialisation; can express hims or herself fluently and spontaneously an give the advantages and disadvantages various options.
<b>C1</b>	Can recognise implicit meaning and e press himself or herself fluently and spo taneously; can comment on complex su jects, using organisational patterns an cohesive devices.
<b>C2</b>	Can understand virtually everything wi ease, express himself or herself very fl ently and spontaneously and differen ates finer shades of meaning even wh commenting on more complex issues.

The DSD (Deutsches Sprachdiplom/German Language Certificate) is a joint undertaking of the German Federal Government and the federal states (Länder).

### DSD – A 2

- corresponds to Level A2 of the CEFR
- provides proof of German language proficiency at the A2 level
- provides career advantages when applying for jobs

### DSD – I

- corresponds to Level B1 of the CEFR
- provides proof of German language proficiency required for admission to preparatory courses at "Studienkollegien" in Germany
- provides advantages when applying to study in Germany

### DSD – II

- corresponds to Levels B2 and C1 of the CEFR
- provides proof of German language proficiency required for admission to institutions of higher education in Germany
