Teaching Venues – Grade 4 to 7

Generous funding from the Ohlthaver Trust has allowed us to enlarge our Science Lab, and it is being recommissioned as a teaching venue for the first time since March 2020 when Covid changed our world. In

addition to this, our Grade 6s are vacating the Multipurpose Room to inhabit the "normal" Grade 6 classroom. The start of the 3rd term will thus see us revert to normal, pre-Covid teaching venues and will result in pupils moving from venue to venue rather than their teachers.

School Bus

The rising cost of fuel has necessitated the school's finance team to reconsider the rate being charged for the morning and afternoon school bus to ensure that the related costs are adequately covered. Parents making use of the bus service will be advised of any changes to the bus fee in due course.

School Uniform and Lost Property

We have a mountain of unclaimed lost property in the office. The children are regularly asked to search through the pile of unclaimed clothes to identify anything that might belong to them. These are mainly items of clothing that are not labelled, or second-hand items bearing the names of past pupils.

We again kindly ask that all parents set aside a little bit of time this holiday to inspect all items of school clothing at home. We suspect that there are many children who are inadvertently wearing items of school uniform that actually belong to someone else. Please check all school clothing at home and label any unmarked items clearly with your child's name. Please also return to the school office any items of clothing belonging to another child!

Please also assist us in ensuring that the DSD children are neat and presentable at all times. Please dispose of old, discoloured and damaged items of uniform and also ensure that children in public places after hours are looking neat and presentable and are wearing shoes whilst in school uniform! We also ask that you do not send your child to school wearing non-DSD jerseys/ jackets or other items of clothing that are not part of our uniform, including jewellery. Our reputation is at stake and we respectfully ask for your support in this matter!

Afternoon Pickup and Aftercare

We respectfully request that you collect your children at the end of the school day from outside their classroom (KiGa to Gr 2) and/ or from the area outside the school reception office (Gr 3 to 7). DSD staff will only dismiss a child once they see the parent/ grandparent, so please don't sit in your car and wait for your child to come to you. Please inform Mrs. Uta Hill at Reception if your child is going home with someone other than their "normal" lift.



Please also note that children not collected within 10 minutes after the close of school will be sent to aftercare, where normal aftercare rates apply. Mrs. Gina Strydom is currently managing our aftercare programme and it is slowly gaining momentum as more families are beginning once again to make use of this service.
